General Information

An infection control focused state licensure survey was conducted under the authority afforded by Parts 201 and 217 of the Public Health Code, Act 368 of 1978, and Licensing Health Facilities and Agencies Administrative Rules, R 325.45101 through 325.45385, with focus on Part 3, Subpart C – Infection Prevention and Control at Medilodge of Westwood.

Survey Findings

Compliant – Findings Through Corrective Actions Identified Onsite:

The survey identified the following findings:

R 325.45139; Rule 139; Personnel; communicable disease screening; immunization; mitigation R 325.45145; Rule 145; Employee; health; communicable disease R 325.45183; Rule 183; Employee records

Interview with the facility staff revealed the facility currently screens new employees for TB and Hepatitis B. It was confirmed that the facility does not conduct baseline screening for communicable diseases as referenced in this administrative rule.

At the time of survey, it was the recommendation of this surveyor to refer to this administrative rule where it addresses the evaluation of the immunization status of personnel for vaccine preventable diseases as designated in the "Healthcare Personnel Vaccination Recommendations," 2017 edition, published by the Immunization Action Coalition (IAC) and utilize the reference titled 'Healthcare Personnel Vaccination Recommendations'.

Actual compliance will be verified at the time of the next onsite licensure survey.

In summary, Medilodge of Westwood is in compliance with the applicable infection control focused portions of Parts 201 and 217 of the Public Health Code, Act 368 of 1978, and Licensing Health Facilities and Agencies Administrative Rules, R 325.45101 through 325.45385.
